The matter was put up before the Chairman D.L.S.A., Nabarangpur with a direction to the Secretary, D.L.S.A., Nabarangpur for taking immediate action. The matter was intimated to the C.S.O., Nabarangpur & Executive Officer, Nabarangpur for issuance of Ration Card in favour of the applicant and compliance report may be intimated at the earliest. Soon after the intervention of D.L.S.A., Nabarangpur the oldwoman namely SaraJanihas got Ration Card.

- b. Success story relates to Smt. Parboti Goudo & Smt. Malti Goudo who filed a grievance petition against her siblings regarding land dispute, which was registered under Pre-Litigation dispute having P.L.A No- 49/2023 on dated 01.07.2023. The matter was put up before the Judge, P&CLA (Nabarangpur) for redressal of the grievance. Notice was issued to the Opposite party by both ways for his appearance and Conciliation. On dated 26.07.2023, 24.08.2023, and 09.09.2023, both the parties appeared before the Judge, P&CLA (Nabarangpur) for settlement of their disputes through conciliation process. Having proceeded through conciliation, they both agreed to settle their dispute amicably and intimated the same in writing to this Authority and are leading their happy conjugal life.
- c. Success story relates to Sri. Nilakantha Das who filed a grievance petition against his brother regardingland dispute, which was registered under Pre-Litigation dispute having PLA No- 57/2023 on dated 05.08.2023. The matter was put up before the Judge, P8sCLA (Nabarangpur) for redressal of the grievance .Notice was issued to the Opposite party by both ways fort their appearance and Conciliation. On dated 24.08.2023 and 09.09.2023, both the parties appeared before the Judge, P8sCLA (Nabarangpur) for settlement of their disputes through Conciliation process. Having proceeded through conciliation, both the parties agreed to settle their dispute amicably and intimated the same line in writing to this Authority and accordingly the case was settled through conciliation.
