The success story relates to an old widow woman namely Usharani Mohanty, aged about 23 years w/o-Jitendra Kumar Harijan of Village-Gandhinagar under Nabarangpur Block who was deprived to get the different benefit of State &Central Govt. such as Ration Card. The matter was put up before the Chairman D.L.S.A.,Nabarangpur with a direction to the Secretary, D.L.S.A., Nabarangpur for taking immediate action. The matter was intimated to the C.S.O., Nabarangpur & Executive Officer,Municipality, Nabarangpur for issuance of Ration Card in favour of the applicant and compliance report may be intimated at the earliest. Soon after the intervention of D.L.S.A., Nabarangpur the Usharani Mohanty got Ration Card. b. Success story relates to Sri Dulabh singh & Sri Dambaru Singh who filed a grievance petition against her siblings regarding land dispute, which was registered under Pre-Litigation dispute having P.L.A No- 38/2023 on dated 07.06.2023. The matter was put up before the Judge, P&CLA (Nabarangpur) for redressal of the grievance. Notice was issued to the Opposite party by both ways for his appearance and Conciliation. On dated 13.07.2023, 16.08.2023, 27.09.2023, and 30.10.2023 both the parties appeared before the Judge, P&CLA (Nabarangpur) for settlement of their disputes through conciliation process. Having proceeded through conciliation, they both agreed to settle their dispute amicably and intimated the same in writing to this Authority and are leading their happy conjugal life.
