G. Other Activities:

On 3rd December 2023 Odisha State Legal Services Authority and all its field units i.e.; 30 DLSAs and 114 TLSCs have observed International Day of Persons with Disabilities by organizing awareness and Legal Literacy camps.

On the eve of International Day of Persons with Disabilities, a Mega Legal Services Camp for the Persons with disabilities was organized by District Legal Services Authority, Khurda at Bhubaneswar in association with District Administration at B.J.B. College ground, Bhubaneswar. The Mega Camp was inaugurated by Hon'ble Dr. Justice Bidyut Ranjan Sarangi, Acting Chief Justice High Court of Orissa and Executive Chairman, Odisha State Legal Services Authority on 03.12.2023 in presence of District Judge-cum-Chairman District Legal Services Authority, the Collector-cum-District Magistrate Khurda, Member Secretary OSLSA & Other Judicial Officers of Khurda District.

The main objective of Organizing of the aforesaid Mega Camp was to create awareness amongst the Persons with disabilities on different activities carried out by the OSLSA and field units with various provisions of law relates to them. On that day, the dignitaries distributed instant benefits to the persons with disabilities under different schemes of both Central & State Government like benefits of Madhubabu Pension Yojana, Marriage Assistant, Wheel Chair, Tri-Cycle, Laptop & Students Scholarship.

H. Success Stories:

Mention success stories which highlight the unwavering spirit of LSIs to provide legal assistance to vulnerable sections of the society. While providing the stories, kindly take note that the stories shall be brief. Success Stories shall include the following:

i. Success Stories wherein Court based legal assistance was provided;

a. Success Stories wherein assistance was provided in availing Welfare Schemes :

1. Through the Para Legal Volunteer, one applicant namely Alpana Buda filed an application before this Authority for proper medical treatment and rehabilitation of her son namely as her son was suffering from mental illness. Thereafter, her application was forwarded to the District Social Security Officer, Jharsuguda for providing necessary medical treatment. This office approached People's Forum NGO, Jharsuguda for his rehabilitation. The patient has been rehabilitated at Mission Ashalok, Badmal, Jharsuguda on 31.12.2023 and now, the patient is residing there with proper care and treatment.
2. On 12.12.2023, the Secretary, DLSA, Phulbani had a visit to District Jail, Phulbani. During the visit it was informed by the Superintendent, I/c, District Jail, Phulbani that one Convict namely Chandrasekhar Pradhani, Vill-Balampadar, PS-Balliguda, Dist-Kandhamal has been released from jail. But no one is present at his home to look after him and he is not financially well off. In this regard this office has requested to the Secretary, Banabasi Old Age Home, Balliguda to take necessary steps for providing him shelter. On 14.12.2023 Sri Chandrasekhar Pradhani has been shifted from his house to Banabasi Old Age Home, Balliguda and provided him shelter to take care of himself.
3. The success story relates to Sri. Simanchal Nayak who filed a grievance petition against his siblings regarding land dispute, which was registered under Pre-Litigation dispute having PLA No- 52/2023 on dated 21.07.2023. The matter was put up before the Judge, P&CLA (Nabarangpur) for redressal of the grievance. Notice was issued to the Opposite party by both ways for his appearance and Conciliation. On dated 16.08.2023, 27.09.2023, 30.10.2023, 22.11.2023 and 09.12.2023, both the parties appeared before the Judge, P&CLA (Nabarangpur) for settlement of their dispute through Conciliation process. Having proceeded through conciliation, they both agreed to settle their dispute amicably and intimated the same line in writing to this Authority and are leading their happy conjugal life.

4. An old lady namely - Auro Behera, W/o- Kalia Behera, At/P. O/P. S- Bhanjpur, Ward No.2, Baripada, Dist- Mayurbhanj who is also a mentally retired person was found abandoned near the village Belgadia, Baripada. She was left by her family and was in very bad condition. After being informed by the Panel Lawyer, the Secretary DLSA, Mayurbhanj Baripada along with PLV rushed to the spot and rescued the old lady. Initially the lady was sheltered in the "SAHARANCHAL NIRASHRAY AASHRAYA STHALI-2 (NULM)", Baripada later she was transferred to Old Age Home for better care and protection.
5. Minakshi Jena and Pradeep Jena resident of Viil/P.O-Chatra Chakada, PS-Derabish, Dist-Kendrapara, faced tough times in their marriage after the birth of their daughter, leading to a six-year separation. To mend their relationship, Minakshi turned to the District Legal Services Authority, Kendrapara for assistance. Through discussions and conciliation, the couple not only resolved their differences but also decided to give their marriage another chance.
6. As per the News Paper article "ସହାୟତା ଅପେକ୍ଷାରେ ଦିବ୍ୟାଙ୍ଗ ବିଶେଷ" published in the Daily Odia Newspaper the SAMBAD Dtd.04.12.2023, Page No-9 regarding necessary assistance required by the disabled persons namely; Bisei Roul, At- Jambubahali, Grampanchayat- Danara, Block-Talcher, Dist- Angul. The District Legal Services Authority, Angul requested to the Chairman, Taluk Legal Services Committee, Talcher vide letter no. 3521 /Dtd.04.12.2023 and the District Social Security Officer, Angul vide letter no. 3521 /Dtd.04.12.2023 to take necessary action for providing necessary assistance to Bisei Roul. Accordingly, The Chairman, Taluk Legal Services Committee, Talcher intimated vide letter no. 239 Dtd. 12.12.2023 that on Dtd. 05.12.2023, a tricycle was given to Bisei Roul, At- Jambubahali, Grampanchayat- Danara, Block-Talcher, Dist- Angul by the Social Security Section of Talcher Block.
