PROTECTING THE FUNDAMENTAL RIGHT IS THE FOREMOST DUTY

i) DLSA Khurda was intimated by OSLSA to redress the grievance of a lady namely Arpita Bhuyan who had just delivered a baby and was on maternity leave. The lady was working as Management Expert-I, SBA Cell under Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation, Bhubaneswar who was kept deprived off her maternity benefits solely on the ground that she is a contractual employee and on being harassed in running from pillar to post she stepped into this Authority on 16.03.2024 for assistance and on heart feeling this issue Secretary DLSA Khurdha requested the Commissioner BMC, Bhubaneswar and the Secretary, Housing and Urban Development, Government of Odisha to consider the case of the applicant lady and accordingly took steps and in response to the same BMC submitted an Action taken wherein it has been stated that 4 months of Maternity Benefit to a tune of Rs.1,87,000/- has been approved by the Board and has been disbursed accordingly.

ii) SKIL DEVELOPMENT TRAINING PROGRAMME FOR JAIL INMATES.

- DLSA Khurda has initiated to impart Skill Development Training Programme on "Renewable Energy-Solar and LED Technology: Vegetable Nursery Management and Cultivation" in collaboration with Rural Development & Self Employment Training Institute(RUDSETI), Bhubaneswar and Govt. ITI, Bhubaneswar for Jail Inmates, Aims and Objectives of the said Training Programme are to make the inmates self-reliant, facilitates employment for them and bring them into the mainstream of the society after they get released from Jail Custody. The Training programmes will be conducted in phase manner. In the first phase, 30nos. of inmates have been selected as per their willingness. The Programme was inaugurated by District Judge-cum-Chairman, DLSA, Khurda on 16.04.2024.
- One Namely Smt. Rubika Kumari Nag @Domb who filed a grievance petition against Sri Palikar Nag regarding land dispute ,which was registered under Pre-litigation dispute having PLA No-0112034 on dated 11.01.2024. The matter was put up before the judge P& CLA (Nabarangpur) for redressal of the grievance, notice was issued to the opposite party by both ways for his condition. On dated 22.01.2024,22.02.2024,22.03.2024, and 20.04.2024 both the parties appeared before the Judge P& CL (Nabarangpur) for settlement of their dispute through conciliation, they both agreed to settle their dispute amicably and intimated the same line in writing to this Authority and are leading their happy conjugal life.
- v) Opening of Saving Bank Account for Victim.
 - A list of beneficiaries who were intimated to appear before DLSA Phulbani for award of victim compensation but they have no saving bank account in a nationalized bank or had tiny account in the bank as result of which compensation awarded to them could not be transferred in their account. In the meantime, DLSA Phulbani facilitated eight numbers of beneficiaries to open Saving Bank Account in their Name in Bank of Maharashtra in a hassle freeway & without any delay and the compensation amount were disbursed on the same date.
