H. Success Stories:

AN ABANDONED 22 DAYS INFANT GOT BACK TO HER PARENTS

This Authority got to know that a child of 22 days has been abandoned by her parents from a Paper Cutting published in Times of India. Pursuant to which this Authority vide its Lr No. 5559/Dtd.29. Ø1.2Ø24 sought for the status of the child from the director Capital Hospital as it has been published in the newspaper that the child was in a critical condition admitted in SNCU, Capital Hospital and instructed the Chairman, CWC to take necessary steps. Immediately Secretary, DLSA visited the hospital along with the DCPO, Khurda and found that baby weighs only 860 gms to which she was admitted in SNCU being referred by Nayagarh, DHH. Sooner thereto, the admission register was seen for finding the whereabouts of her parents, thereafter the S.P., Nayagarh was requested by this Authority to know the whereabouts of her parents and after her parents were traced S.P. Nayagrah with CWC, Nayagrah interacted with the parents and finally her parents came to Capital Hospital, Bhubaneswar to look after their baby girl.Due to the intervention of DLSA Khurda a child was saved from being abandoned.

UTP's CHILD REHABILITATED

While the Secretary, DLSA, Khurda was in her unannounced visit to Special Jail, Bhubaneswar an UTP namely Biswanath Kisku a resident of Mayurbhanj, with deep grief ventilated his grievance to the effect that he is the sole one who was looking after his Child namely Satyajit Kisku and after he being imprisoned his child is being neglected and is deprived of his basic facilities such as Studies, Fooding, Clothing etc. and to which this Authority vide L r. No. 827/Dtd .07.02.2024 requested Collector-Cum-District Magistrate, Mayurbhanj to look into the matter and take necessary steps and the Secretary, DLSA,

Mayurbhanj was requested to follow up in the process. In pursuance thereof the Secretary, DSLA, Mayurbhanj intimated this Authority vide its Lr. No. 362/Dtd.27.02.2Ø24 that the Child has been rescued, placed before the CWC, Baripada and pursuance thereof has been lodged to Children Home, Baripada whereon the CWC, has taken the responsibility in protecting his basic rights.

VOICE OF THE VOICELESS

On 09.02.2024 the Secretary, DLSA Khurda had been in her visit to Mission Ashra a shelter home for mentally destitute ladies and it was seen that the ladies were suffering from various diseases and to stand for the voiceless this Authority took steps and requested the Founder, IMS-SUM Hospital to set up a Mega Free Health Check-up Camp at Mission Ashra to which the founder consented and a Mega Free Health Check-Up Camp was set up on 16.02.2024 wherein doctors from 6 departments (i.e., Medicine, Skin, Dental, O&G, Psychiatric and Eye) were present and examined the inmates i. e, 272 in numbers and crept in conducting different tests followed by distribution of free medicines.

DISPUTE BETWEEN THE FAMILY RESOLVED THROUGH MEDIATION

Applicant Bijaya Kumar Pattanaik approached this DLSA Khurda with a goal to get his family properties partitioned without getting into litigation as the co-sharers gave a deaf-ear to him and that led in filing of this PLM, to which the O. P.s were noticed and pursuant thereto O. P.s appeared and consented for Mediation. Thereafter, Mediator was appointed and on rigorous counsel ling the matter was settled between the parties and a family was saved from Jumping and drowning in litigations.

Three Orphans Rehabilitated.

It came to notice of the DLSA, Koraput -Jeypore through News Paper Publication in the daily Newspaper Sambad dtd. 28.01.2024 titled (Andharare Tini Anatha Sishu/ Three Orphans in Dark), that the children namely Kumari Ramita Saunta, aged about 13 years, Niranjan Saunta, aged about 09 years and Rahul Saunta aged about 6 years of Marchiguda village pindapadar GP, under Dasmantapur Block of Koraput District after back to back death of their parents living with their grandmother at Marchiguda in distress condition. Their grandmother also faced many difficulties in taking care of the children. Accordingly, one trained PLV deputed to look in to the matter and ascertained the condition of the family. Accordingly, the PLV submitted the report to Secretary DLS A Koraput about their measurable condition. Immediately the Secretary DLSA Koraput communicate with District Child Protection Officer, District welfare officer & BDO Dasmantpur for their rehabilitation. In response to that the District Child Protection officer, Koraput vide letter no 214/02.03.2014 has intimated that all three orphan children already have produced before the CWC, Koraput and as per the direction of CWC, Koraput they have Rehabilitateed at Child care Institution _IDS, Dasmantpur, Koraput.
