## **SUCCESS STORIES FOR THE MONTH OF MAY, 2024**

### **1. HANDS TO THE CLUELESS**

A young boy of 19 years who is a deaf and dumb was released from Special Jail, Bhubaneswar. While the Secretary, DLSA, Khurda was on her visit to Special Jail, Bhubaneswar found the said young boy was brought behind the bars in connection with Baliana P.S. Case no. 20/2024 u/s. 341, 323,325, 294, 509, 307, 34, IPC, r/w. sec 3(1)(r) and Sec 3 (1) (s) of SC, ST and POA Act and immediately directed the office of Legal Aid Defense Counsel to take expeditious steps in this matter.

Pursuant to such direction the office of Legal Aid Defense Counsel took expeditious steps in protecting the fundamental right of the UTP and filed a petition u/s.167 of Cr.P.C. on the very 121st Day of forwarding and the UTP was released from Custody.

### **2. CONFLICT IS INEVITABLE BUT COMBAT IS OPTIONAL**

One STS Limited a Pvt. Ltd. Company knocked the doors of this Authority and filed a petition for mediation by and between SIS Ltd. and Balesore Alloys Ltd with a ray of hope to get back its stuck money to a tune of Rs. 1,23,41,714/- (one Crore Twenty-Three Lakhs Forty-One Thousand Seven Hundred and fourteen Only) along with Interest @18%. Thereafter, this Authority took up Steps for Mediation and persistent efforts the dispute was resolved between the parties and the petitioner company got his stuck money recovered from the o.p.-Company.

3. The Story relates to Sri Ibrahim Bag who filed a grievance petition against her wife Smt.Rina Harijan Regarding family dispute, which was registered under pre-litigation dispute having PLA No-3/2024 on dated 25.01.2024. The matter was put up before the judge ,P&CLA(Nabarangpur) for redressal of the grievance. Notice was issued to the opposite party by both ways for her appearance and conciliation. On different dated both the parties appeared before the judge, P&CIA Nabarangpur for settlement of their dispute through conciliation process. Having Proceeded through conciliation, they both agreed to settle their disputes amicably and are leading their Happy conjugal life.

4. During the jail visit by the secretary,DLSA ,Koraput to Special Jail Jeypore on 14.05.2024 one female UTPs namely Smt.Bondai Khondha and Smt.Radama Harijan submitted before the secretary that ,since, they are in jail custody their children namely Sunam Khondha(13yrs),Nandini Khondha(7yrs.)and Amita Khondha(7yrs.) of UTP Smt. Bondai Khondha and Nandini Harijan (11yrs) of UTP Smt. Radma Harijan are leaving in a helpless and distress condition at their village. There is no one at their home to look after their livelihood and education. Hence, prayed for rehabilitation of their children and also to provide educational facilities for the helpless children.

Accordingly, correspondence has been made with the DCPO, Koraput and CWC, Koraput for taking appropriate steps for rescue, rehabilitation and education of the minor children. In response to the same the Children have been recused by the team of CWC, Koraput and DCPO, Koraput and produced before Chirman, DLSA, Koraput and later on they are rehabilitated at ASTHA, Children Home, on 19.05.24 under the supervision of Secretary, DLSA, Koraput-Jeypur.
