i) An Ounce of Mediation is Worth a Pound of Arbitration and a Ton of Litigation

The Applicant -company namely M/s. Subhasish Jena Engineers and Builders Private Limited banged the doors of DLSA Khurda for resolution of dispute by and between the parties. The Applicant being a construction company has bagged the Tender from the O. P. -Company undertaken by the Government of India for construction of a school in Keonjhar and for that the Contract was executed with the Consideration amount of Rs.16,69, 88,346.82/ and the tender amount was inclusive of all duty and taxes and as per the norms the applicant-company deposited to a tune of .RS.83, 49,418/ for requirement of NIT. Thereafter, the applicant -company started with the work at the work site as undertaken and that was going smoothly, until disputes arouse between the parties on the intervention of local villagers in regards to construction of an approaching road. Thereafter the O.P. company noticed applicant company for cancellation of the contract which led in filing of the case. Pursuant thereto DLSA Khurda intervened in the matter and the matter was settled by the parties calling off the cancellation notice there by the O.P. company. The matter ended as successful as the mediation process saved the applicant company from losing huge loss of Rs.166988346.82, so also saved its goodwill.

ii) This Authority Became the Light at The End of the Tunnel

The Applicant namely Mrs. Swagatika Sahoo, aged 33 years, a widow and young mother of two children finding no other way out, approached DLSA Khurda and grieved off seeking for assistance for having a better livelihood and education of her children. Then and their Secretary, DLSA, Khurda at Bhubaneswar requested the District Child Protection Officer and the District Social Security officer of Khurda to include the applicant and her children under the floating Government Scheme, i.e. Widow Pension and Mission Vastalya Scheme. Pursuant thereto the DSSO and DCPO took expeditious steps to include Swagatika Sahoo in to the the MBPS and her children in to Mission Vastalya scheme and with this the fundamental Right of the family is kept enacted. The efforts of DLSA Khurda brought Smile to her family.

iii) <u>In Time of Test, Family is Best</u>

While on visit to the CCI, Bhairabi club, the secretary, DLSA Khurdha found children who were rescued from different places of Khurdha and have been residing thereon verification it could be elicited that the children hails from different interior parts of the state and their families were not been aware of such fact. To get the children unite with their families, the Secretary, DLSA, immediately prepared a action plan with different stake holders of the district and requested to concerned Superintendent of Police and the Secretary, DLSAS to give effect to the action plan. Pursuant thereto, the child namely Ajaya Majhi, aged 14 years about who the family was searching for since a long time got back to his family with the help of Secretary, DLSA Balasore. The Child namely N.Omm Rao got back to his family with the help of Secretary, DLSA, Ganjam and about the left over children of Keonihar district, the IG Crime of Odisha being the Nodal officer of missing child has taken the responsibilities to her shoulder and the families being identified and intimated about the same and would be united soon.

A news article was published in Daily Odia News Paper Pragatibadi that one widow lady namely Mamata Majhi of Kirkita Village under Khariar Block has deprived of all the Govt. Scheme meant for poor people. After publication of the same, the District Legal Services Authority, Nuapada engaged one PLV to extend legal aid to that poor lady. The PLV visited the house of Mamta Majhi and collected all the relevant documents and submitted before the appropriate authority.
