## **Success Stories**

### **1. RESTORING CONJUGAL HARMONY.**

The lady namely Bijayalaxmi Mohapatra being mentally and physically tortured by her husband and in-laws knocked the door of the DLSA Khurda to explore the possibilities of amicable settlement of her disputes with her husband and in-laws. The DLSA Khurda registered her grievance. Pre-litigation Mediation was taken up between the parties and on persistent efforts the disputes between the duo was amicably settled and the estranged couple reunited.

### **2. LEADING A HELPING HAND TO RECOVER STUCK MONEY.**

The Applicant approached the DLSA Khurda for exploring the ways and means to recover the money ,Applicant M/S Omm Surgical and Chemicals had supplied Microscope for an amount of Rs.9,13,920/- to the Office of Chief District Medical Officer ,Jharsuguda in the, year 2018, but the O.P. after receiving the consignment did not persuade to release the payment to which the applicant filed the present application and the pre institution Mediation was initiated and on persistent efforts the O.P. got back its money recovered.

### **3. SAVING THE PUBLIC MONEY**

The applicant State Bank of India Knocked the doors of DLSA Khurda for recovery of the money lended to the O.P. as the O.P. after taking a loan of RS.8,79,790/-did not pay a heed to refund it, to which the O.P. was noticed and pursuant to the persistent efforts the matter was resolved and the bank recovered its money in full.

### **4. RESCUE AND REHABILITATE TO MENTAL ILL.**

One applicant namely Tarabati Dila filed an application before DLSA Jharsuguda & prayed for proper medical treatment and rehabilitation of his daughter namely Rjta Dila as she was suffering from mental illness. Thereafter her application was forwarded to the District Social Security Officer, Jharsuguda requesting him to provide necessary medical treatment and rehabilitate to the patient. Further, DLSA Jharsuguda approached to the People's Forum NGO, Jharsuguda for her rehabilitation & treatment. The patient has been rehabilitated at Mission Ashra, H. Katapali, Jharsuguda on 18.07.2024 and now, the patient is residing there with proper care and treatment.
