## **Success Stories**

1. As per the instruction of the Chairman DLSA, Phulbani, the Secretary, DLSA, Phulbani had a visit to the construction side of New Civil Courts Building, Phulbani dtd. 10.06.2024, it was found that five numbers of children namely Rama Hansda, Sai Hansda, Rohit Singh, Bina Soren, & Rina Soren were found residing with their parents, who works as construction workers in the sites, devoid of all basic amenities available for children of their age like health, food, education, hygiene, drinking water. The children are residing in temporary cabin with their parents. Amidst dust, dirt affecting their overall development and depriving them of their basic rights. In this regard the Secretary DLSA Phulbani has requested to the DCPO, Phulbani to provide necessary benefits of integrated Child development (ICDS) to the above-mentioned children as per law. On dtd.02.08.2024 the DCPO, Phulbani intimated this office that all five numbers of children have been enrolled in nearby Anganwadi Centre.
2. During monthly jail visit by this Authority with the panel experts to the jails of Kandhmal District, UTPs namely Ranjita Mallick, Sadasiba Nayak of Circle Jail, Phulbani and convict namely Birendra Majhi of Sub jail G.udayagiri expressed their grievance and filed prisoners petition before this Authority regarding rehabilitation of their children .Pursuant to the directions issued by this Authority ,the DCPO Phulbani intimated this office that two children of UTP Ranjita Mallik have been rehabilitated and accommodated to stay at Govt. Girls Residential Nodal UP School, Phiringia and one child of Convic Birendra Majhi has been rehabilitated and accommodated to stay and study at RCM Child Care Institution, Mandasore, Raikia after proper verification of documents and as per the rules and procedure prescribed with the help of CWC, Kandhamal.

### **3. Hands to the Needy**

On 14.08.2024 an old lady namely Malati Pradhan from Puri who was kicked out of house by her sons and finding no way out she was sitting at the Aadhar kendra situated besides ADR building. A PLV namely Rajani panda witnessed her and went to her for reasons therefore to which she cried and asked for shelter, thereafter she was brought to the office of DLSA by the PLV and her son was contacted over telephone to take her back to which her son bluntly denied. Thereafter the Secretary, DLSA, Khurda immediately contacted with DSSO, Khurda and the old lady was given with a shelter at Old Age Home.

### **4. Helpless parents got back their minor child**

On the 7<sup>th</sup> day of August,2024 a minor girl had left her parental house just because her parents denied to give her parents denied to give her a smart phone and she was found roaming in the street by one of our PLVs ,soon thereafter she was brought to the office of DLSA Khurda and her parents were contacted and were given the impression was presided over the

Secretary DLSA and the Child was made convinced of the pros and cons of using a mobile phone at this tender age and finally the child was made agreed and left for home with her parents.

**5. An initiative towards making Bhubaneswar as Child friendly**

To ensure right to education of a child and children are safeguarded against all forms of abuse, neglect and exploitation and for addressing it this Authority took an initiative in coordination with the stakeholders who is entrusted with the responsibility of child rights and formed a team comprising of B.D.O., Bhubaneswar, all C.D.P.O.s, D.C.P.O., Khurda, D.E.O., Khurda, SJPU Unit, Bhubaneswar, I.I.C., IHATU, Assistant Public Prosecutors and Social Organisations to undertake a comprehensive effort to make Bhubaneswar Block a child friendly block at all levels. The Child Friendly initiative is expected to create a positive environment through adopting child sensitive and responsive measures across the Bhubaneswar Block on a pilot basis in Khordha district. This initiation focused on major four domain areas, that address direct and indirect impact on Children.

Following four domains are:

1. Child Survival especially focusing on health and nutrition.
2. Child Development focusing on early childhood education, free and compulsory elementary education.
3. Child Protection focusing on prevention of child marriage, protection from sexual abuses and gender-based violence, Prevention of child labour and other such vulnerabilities.
4. Child Participation focusing on participation on Gram Sabha, Bal Sabha, Ward Sabha (in case of ULBs), SMCs, GPCPC, VLCWPC etc.

Efforts were made to identify the number of child dropouts and it was found that 268 children were identified as drop-outs simultaneously measures were taken to minimize the impact and create a supportive environment for continuing their educations and the followings have been made:

1. Children were enrolled in appropriate class based on their age.
2. Efforts underway to re-integrate them into different educational institutions.
3. Career Counselling session were conducted with an aim to guide and motivate students to stay in school and purpose of education.
4. Recognising the challenge faced by various children from deprived off basic higher education, financial support was extended.
5. Different volunteers and social organisations demonstrated their commitment to combat such issued.
6. This Authority conducted orientation and capacity building programme at regular intervals to enable community mobilization and outreach to change social norms, perception and attitude and educate about harm caused to the children on account of child marriage.
7. Awareness programme was conducted on preventing child marriage, child trafficking, child dropout, illegal adoption and similar issues.
